 8th Grade Orchestra "Hadley Strings" ~ 4th year students playing in 8<sup>th</sup> grade orchestra level

## 6th & 7th Grade Orchestra Expectations

- Attend all lessons and arrive on time.
- Be prepared with instrument, music and pencil
- Practice at home on a regular basis
- Perform at all concerts and rehearsals. If there is a conflict with any after school rehearsal or concert, please
  contact the director by email or phone a month ahead of time and discuss the situation. This allows the
  director to adjust a seating arrangement or the director can assist in finding a way for your child to make the
  rehearsal or concert by brainstorming the situation.

## 8th Grade Orchestra "Hadley String" Orchestra Expectations

Communication is extremely important with the orchestra director

- Arrive on time and be prepared with instrument, music and pencil
- Practice at home on a regular basis.
- It is required that all students attend the very few before-school rehearsals 7:20am-8:15am. Rehearsals
  dates will be given at a later time. The faculty at Hadley offers many activities and review sessions before
  and after school. According to certain academic situations, exceptions may be made at the discretion of the
  orchestra director upon communication with the parent.
- If your child cannot attend a morning rehearsal due to a school absence, please email the orchestra director.
- If a child is in a sport that conflicts with the orchestra schedule, there must be a discussion between the
  parent, coach and the orchestra director to figure out a scheduling solution. We do thi each year with
  students and this does not pose a problem.
- Perform at all concerts and clinics. If there is a conflict with any concert or clinic, please contact the director by email or phone a month ahead of time and discuss the situation. This will allow the director to adjust a seating arrangement or the director can assist in finding a way for your child to make the concert or competition by brainstorming the situation.
- A student must be prepared to perform at all clinics. If it appears that a student may not be prepared to
  perform at a festival/clinic, the director will contact the family to discuss the situation. In rare instances, a
  child who isn't prepared may not be able to perform.

## **Orchestra Attendance Requirements & Grades**

#### 6th & 7th Grade Orchestra

- Orchestra class meets every day and students do NOT miss any other academic classes.
- One after school orchestra rehearsal before each concert to combine the 2 orchestra classes. A late bus will be provided for your child if they ride the bus home. The Hadley late bus departs at 4:45pm Monday through Friday.
- Two Hadley Concerts: one in the winter and one in the spring.
- Students will receive a grade for performances, class participation, scales, group and individual playing tests, and activities, etc. Work Habits grades will also be given.

#### 8th Grade Orchestra (Hadley String Orchestra)

- Orchestra class meets every day and students do NOT miss any other academic classes.
- 2 or 3 rehearsals before each concert that will occur before school to combine the 2 orchestra classes.
- 2 Hadley Concerts; one winter and one spring
- In school clinic in February/March
- Possible out of school Orchestra Festival in March/April
- Students will receive a grade for performances, class participation, scales, group and individual playing tests, and activities, etc. Work Habits grades will also be given.

## Your support and your child's success in practice

Music achievement requires effort over a period of time. The time in orchestra lessons is limited. New concepts learned at school need daily personal practice time by your child at home in order for these new skills to be developed. You can help your child by:

#### At home:

- Show your child that you are interested in what they are learning on their instrument.
- Help your child establish a practice routine, provide a regular time and place to practice.
- Remaining nearby during practice times as often as possible.
- Have your child play for you and others.
- Keep the instrument and music in good condition. Extreme temperature and dryness can crack the wood.
  - o Do not keep instrument in a car for extreme amounts of time
  - Do not keep instrument near heating vents, windows, doorways or air conditioners
- Provide opportunities for your child to hear and see others perform through live performances, TV, recordings, radio.
- Praise your child and be patient, learning is a continuous process that takes time.

#### At school:

- Teach your child the importance of being prepared and on time for rehearsals and performances. The orchestra is a team and all members rely on each other.
- Attend all of your child's performances.
- Please communicate with your child's teacher when necessary.

# HADLEY ORCHESTRA CLASSROOM SUPPLIES

All students need these supplies by the opening of school.

- Instrument
- Luggage tag or name tag attached to instrument case

**Before school begins**: label with child's first and last name

• Method book:

6th grade students will receive Essential Elements for Strings Book 1

7th grade students will receive Essential Elements for Strings Book 2

8th grade students will receive Essential Technique for Strings Book 3

The new lesson/method book will be purchased through the school and will be distributed at school. You will provide payment via a fee assigned through the school.

• 1" three-ring black binder with a clear plastic cover on front

**Before school begins**: write/print the following on a sheet of paper and insert in the clear plastic cover: first and last name, instrument, orchestra period

• Set of 3 dividers

Before school begins: label the 3 dividers as: 1)warm ups, 2) music 3) important papers

• 20 sheet protectors

Before school begins: insert page protectors in binder

- Set of pencils (replenish as needed)
- Set of 2 different colored highlighters
- Pencil pouch that clips into a 3-ring binder to hold writing utensils
- One large binder clip for method/lesson book

**Before school begins:** put pencils, highlighters, and binder clip in pouch and clip into binder

- Clip on tuner or app for phone
- Metronome or app for phone
- Cotton cloth to remove rosin on instrument and bow
- Box of tissues
